Sabbatical Note:

I will be taking a one-month Sabbatical from May 9 – early June. While the norm is to take 3 – 6 months, I could not imagine taking such a long leave. I enjoy too much of my time with you and working together to further Christ's mission to transform this world into a place reflecting God's beauty and peace. So, I have decided to take a couple of shorter periods away instead of one longer period. My goal is to become refreshed but also learn something(s) that have the potential to enhance our community going forward. This time away in May, I will be serving as the visiting priest at the Anglican Church of St. Bartholomew on the island of St. Barts and wrapping up this trip with a few days visiting Puerto Rico. I spent many days of my youth in Puerto Rico and plan to revisit familiar places as well as the rain forest and kayaking on one of its bioluminescent bays. I will be taking another short leave later this year.

An additional rationale for the church's encouragement of a clergy Sabbatical is to create an opportunity for the community to further develop its leadership and community building capabilities. During this period, the community can discover the gifts with which God has endowed its members. To quote Paul, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.
